RESOLUTION NO. 3566 RESOLUTION APPROVING THE MILL RIVER PARK AND GREENWAY RULES AND REGULATIONS AS SUBMITTED BY THE MILL RIVER COLLABORATIVE

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 175-1 of the City of Stamford Code of Ordinances, as amended by the Board of Representatives by action taken simultaneously herewith, the Mill River Collaborative of the City of Stamford has promulgated rules and regulations for use of the Mill River Park and Greenway; and

WHEREAS, said rules and regulations are necessary for the proper safety, maintenance, security, and efficient operation of the Mill River Park and Greenway; and

WHEREAS, Section 175-1 of the Code of Ordinances (amended as aforesaid) provides that regulations adopted by the Mill River Collaborative for the use of the Mill River Park and Greenway must be approved by the Board of Representatives; and


WHEREAS, it is intended that this Resolution take effect simultaneously with the aforesaid amendment of Section 175-1;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the following regulations shall apply to the Mill River Park and Greenway in the City of Stamford:

Rules of Mill River Park

Mill River Park opens at 6:00 am and closes at 10:00 pm

In Mill River Park

You are welcome...

- to enjoy the park, including the great lawn, when open
- to spread blankets on the lawn, but not plastic material or tarpaulins
- to picnic, if you leave the area the way you found it
- to enjoy the gardens without entering flowerbeds or picking flowers
- to use a park chair or one seat on a bench designed for sharing
- to experience nature and the river safely with adult supervision for small children
- to deposit waste in trash or recycling receptacles
- to walk your dog, on a leash and not on the grass, if you clean up after it
- to take souvenir photos, commercial photography by Mill River Collaborative permit only
- to ride bicycles or rollerblade on asphalt paths, if you yield to pedestrians at all times

Park guidelines prohibit...

- drug use
- alcohol use except at events specifically permitted by the Mill River Collaborative and the City
- smoking or use of tobacco
- team sports, except in specifically permitted areas
- sitting, climbing or standing on railings and fences
- feeding wildlife of any kind
- harassing wildlife
- amplified music that disturbs others
- performances, except by permit

- commercial activity, except by permit
- obstructing park entrances
- skateboarding and bicycle riding or rollerblading at high speeds or other than on asphalt paths
- any activity that damages park property

By entering the Park, you agree that you will not:

- damage or remove lawns, trees, shrubs, flowers, benches, drinking fountains or any other property or equipment
- discard paper or trash except in containers provided by the City for such purposes
- bring into the park or discard any household debris whatsoever at any time
- have an unleashed animal
- fail or refuse to clean-up after a pet
- sell goods or food without a permit from Mill River Collaborative, and Office of Operations Permit (Cashiering & Permitting Division)
- light fires except in picnic grills or fireplaces placed by the City
- hold mass meetings or public assemblies except with a Mill River Collaborative Permit
- serve or consume alcoholic beverages, except pursuant to specific permits granted by the City and the Mill River Collaborative
- drive a vehicle
- use glass bottles or containers of any kind.
- make loud or disturbing noises, including amplified music
- wash or repair vehicles in the park
- play ball or organized games except in areas plainly designated for such activity
- post signs on trees or other park property
- disobey posted signs or warnings
- drive or chip golf balls in a park
- hunt, trap, or pursue wild life
