

**SENSE OF THE BOARD RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING THE
STAMFORD BABE RUTH 15 YEAR OLD ALL-STAR TEAM ON WINNING
THE 2010 CONNECTICUT STATE CHAMPIONSHIP AND THE NEW
ENGLAND REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP**

WHEREAS, on July 26, 2010, the Stamford Babe Ruth 15 Year Old All-Stars won the Connecticut State Championship over Ridgefield, sending the team to the New England Regional Championship; and

WHEREAS, on August 9, 2010, the Stamford Babe Ruth 15 Year Old All-Stars won the New England Regional Championship over the team from Leominster, Massachusetts, sending the team to the Babe Ruth 13-15 Year Old World Series in Monticello, Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, the team was undefeated during the summer, having an 11-0 post-season record, including a 4-0 record during the New England Regional games, winning three games on walk-off hits; and

WHEREAS, prior to facing Leominster in the championship game, the team defeated teams from Portland, Maine; Cranston, Rhode Island and Plymouth, Massachusetts; and

WHEREAS, the team then proceeded to proudly represent the City of Stamford in the Babe Ruth World Series in Monticello, Arkansas, finishing in Fifth Place; and

WHEREAS, these victories were achieved because of the teamwork of all of the players, the excellent coaching by John Calo, John Rivera and Buddy Moynihan and because of the support of the parents and the rest of the Stamford community;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the 28th Board of Representatives that it congratulates the Stamford Babe Ruth 15 Year Old All-Stars on winning the Connecticut State Championship and the New England Regional Championship; and
