THANKING AUDREY COSENTINI FOR HER MANY
YEARS OF SERVICE TO THE CITY OF STAMFORD**

WHEREAS, Audrey Cosentini has demonstrated a commitment to making Stamford a better place for all, evidenced through her many years of volunteering in many different ways as well as by her participation in city government; and

WHEREAS, Audrey Cosentini was the first woman police commissioner in the City of Stamford, going on to serve as Chair and Vice-Chair of the Stamford Police Commission as well as serving as a Trustee of the Police Pension Board; and

WHEREAS, Audrey Cosentini was elected to the Board of Representatives, and rose to a position of leadership as Co-Minority Leader; and

WHEREAS, Audrey Cosentini was also elected to the Stamford Board of Education, serving as President and holding memberships on multiple committees; along with her work in education, she was elected Secretary of the Board of Directors of the Connecticut Association of Boards of Education; and

WHEREAS, Audrey Cosentini has most recently served on the Stamford Zoning Board for seventeen years; and

WHEREAS, Audrey Cosentini has been active in many other community organizations, including the Citizens' Caucus, PTA Council, the Republican Town Committee and as a member of the Board of Directors of the Stamford Land Conservation Trust; and

WHEREAS, in 1999 Audrey Cosentini was recognized by the Stamford Historical Society as one of Stamford's "Notable Women."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the 28th Board of Representatives extends its sincere thanks and appreciation to Audrey Cosentini for her many years of volunteerism and service to the City of Stamford.
